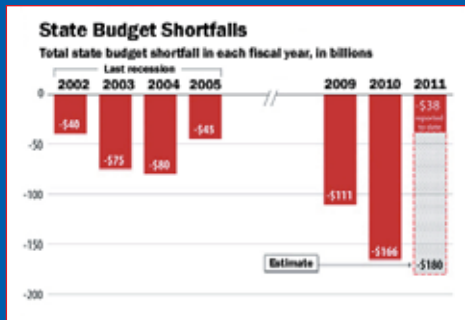
Changing our national priorities

Women Legislators' Lobby (WiLL) is a powerful presence in state and national politics. We have members in all 50 states, representing millions of constituents. **WiLL's mission is to:**

- Educate Congress to redirect excessive military spending toward unmet human and environmental needs
- Encourage women to run for higher office
- Curb the proliferation of weapons, particularly nuclear weapons

State Budgets in Crisis

As states struggle to provide basic services, the federal budget remains skewed toward misplaced priorities. The Pentagon consumes half the discretionary budget, and sends billions each year to unnecessary Cold War weapons.
